

ICD-10-CM Updates: DSM-5 Crosswalk Important Claim Submission News

The National Center for Health Statistics (NCHS) has released the Fiscal Year 2017 ICD-10-CM code set which includes some changes for some Mental Health conditions effective October 1, 2016. The American Psychiatric Association has posted a one-page "at-a-glance" view of the updates as they relate to conditions defined in the Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders, Fifth Edition (DSM-5TM). Annual updates to ICD-10-CM

NCHS is responsible for the use of ICD-10 in the United States. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention maintains ICD-10-CM files in PDF and XML formats for the current as well as past years. CDC.gov > NCHS > Classifications of Diseases, Functioning, and Disability.

Some impact to Mental Health Diagnostic Codes Effective October 1, 2016

There are approximately 14 ICD-10-CM diagnostic codes that have changed. They were either terminated or revised in some way. The American Psychiatric Association has updated coding for DSM-5 conditions accordingly (link below).



Date of Service (DOS) determines which ICD-10-CM Fiscal Year to Apply

- For DOS on or before September 30, 2016, apply the ICD-10- CM code for FY 2016
- For DOS on or after October 1, 2016, apply the ICD-10-CM code for FY 2017
- For inpatient claims, the date of discharge determines the DOS
