Assessment

All Optum enrollees over 11 years of age should be screened for substance use disorders as part of the assessment process. Several brief assessment tools are available, and Optum encourages the use of such screening tools as:

- AUDIT-C
- CAGE
- CRAFFT

Best Practice

Beginning intensive treatment early provides patients with the support often needed to begin recovery.

Optum suggests that individuals newly diagnosed with an Alcohol and Other Drugs disorder (AOD) who are receiving outpatient treatment be seen at least weekly for a minimum of six weeks, in addition to attending community-based support groups.

When treating enrollees with Dual Diagnoses, remember to include all diagnosis codes on each claim.
