Become a Buprenorphine Waivered Practitioner

Learn how to become a buprenorphine waivered practitioner to treat opioid use disorder (OUD).

Qualified providers can receive a practitioner waiver to administer, dispense and prescribe buprenorphine. Increasing the number of eligible practitioners assists in the expansion of available Medicated-Assisted Treatment options.

 Qualified practitioners include Physicians, Nurse Practitioners (NPs), Physician Assistants (PAs), Clinical Nurse Specialists (CNSs), Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist (CRNAs), and Certified Nurse-Midwifes (CNMs). Physicians will need 8 hours of training. Nurses and Physician Assistants will need 24 hours of training.

Training

SAMHSA funds the <u>Providers' Clinical Support System (PCSS)</u> to provide practitioner training in the evidence-based prevention and treatment of OUD and offers the required trainings needed to apply for the buprenorphine waiver.
