

ASAM Opioid Use Disorder Mini-Course: Treatment in the Emergency Department



Training Description

The Emergency Department (ED) is often the primary source of medical care for individuals with an opioid use disorder (OUD). ED visits offer an opportunity to initiate life saving treatment for these patients. ED initiated treatment and referral is associated with a lower risk of overdose, a more successful transition to outpatient care, and better outcomes.

In response, Optum partnered with the American Society of Addiction Medicine (ASAM) to develop a 1-hour on-demand training course. The course provides an overview of opioid use disorder, evidence—based treatment solutions in the emergency department as well as education on identifying and managing patients with opioid use disorder (OUD) in the ED.

The target audience are prescribers in the Emergency Department who are seeking to initiate buprenorphine for the treatment of opioid use disorder (OUD).
