Idaho Clinical Supervision I: Learning Collaborative

August 20-21, 2020 | 9:00am-4:00pm MDT

Course Description:

Clinical Supervision I is for the beginning supervisor as well as those who have experience in clinical supervision. Participants will have an opportunity to learn a model of Clinical Supervision that includes observation of counselors, providing feedback, rating counselor performance, and writing a professional development plan to improve counselor performance. This two-day training combined with four follow-up learning collaborative meetings is designed to increase understanding and skill in assessing counselors in mental health and substance use treatment settings and building learning plans to guide their continued professional growth and development. This learning collaborative emphasizes the importance of structure and collaborative teaching and mentoring aspects of clinical supervision.

The Learning Collaboratives consists of (4) one-hour online learning collaborative meetings will occur virtually and be split into small groups of 6 to 10 participants. The trainer will review the materials from the virtual training and discuss with participants how to incorporate these skills and practices into their work. Exact times for the one-hour sessions to be determined and shared during the initial training. Participants must attend at least three follow up meetings in order to receive their CEUs.

15 CEUs will be available upon completion of the virtual training and the learning collaborative sessions
