

PROVIDER ALERT Mandatory Reporting Reminders October 15, 2020

Alert Summary: This alert contains reminders about reporting responsibilities for all providers and details available mandatory reporting resources.

Dear Provider,

We would like to take this time to remind you of some important requirements and resources regarding reporting.

Mandatory Reporting of Abuse, Abandonment, and Neglect

Mandatory reporting is an important method for protecting vulnerable children and adults in Idaho. Idaho Code § 16-1605 and Code § 39-5303 respectively require those working for or serving vulnerable children or adults who have reason to believe that a vulnerable child or adult is being or has been abused, abandoned, or neglected to immediately report the known or suspected instances of abuse, abandonment, or neglect to the proper (adult or child) law enforcement agency or the Idaho Department of Health and Welfare (IDHW) within 24 hours of discovery. Any mandatory reporter who fails to make a report has committed a misdemeanor and will be subject to professional discipline.
